## North Lake Yacht Club

Since 1953 the North Lake Yacht Club has been promoting competitive sailing, family oriented events, and fellowship within the Lake Country community. Over the years, many families have found the yacht club to provide an ideal opportunity for participating in sailboat races and to get to know other people with common interests. The NLYC is an active member of the Inland Lakes Yachting Association and the Wisconsin Yachting Association and participates in many regional and national regattas.

The yacht club presently has over 500 members (180 families) with a beautiful clubhouse, waterfront, and grounds for hosting regattas and year-round member social events.

The yacht club currently has five active sailing fleets. The 20' C scow has one large main sail and is normally raced by two people. The 16' MC scow is designed to be sailed by one or two people. The Laser class is a 14' single-handed boat. The X boat is a stable, flat bottomed boat with a main sail and jib which is sailed by two children ages 16 and younger. The Optimist is a very stable flat bottomed boat used to teach sailing to children ages 5-12.

The yacht club provides races and regattas throughout the summer. Series races are currently scheduled on Saturday and Sunday mornings, and Wednesday nights. Multiple race regattas are held on Memorial Day, Fourth of July, and Labor Day weekends. Other special races include the Parents race, Moonlight race, and Small Lake race. Yacht club members often come out on their boats to watch the races as well.

The NLYC also hosts the annual Pram Power regatta the first Thursday in August, and the MC Fall Classic regatta the third weekend in September. Both draw sailors from around Wisconsin.



## North Lake Sailing School

The North Lake Sailing School conducts a variety of classes using professional instructors. Children 16 years and under attend bi-weekly sessions to learn basic sailing skills, boating safety, and racing techniques. Much of the class time involves on-the-water training. Camp Sail-away is also offered as an alternative week-long session. Private lessons are available for adults as well.

The NLSS has a fleet of sailboats that are available to beginning sailors before they commit to purchasing their own boat. The NLSS is a 501C3 organization.
