

GIFTS, GRANTS AND BEQUESTS

3010

The District may accept and use any bequest or gift of money or property for a purpose determined appropriate by the Board. A bequest or gift of significant value, over \$15,000, should be accompanied by a letter from the donor for official action and recognition by the Board. If accepted, a letter of appreciation signed by the Administrator will be sent to the donor.

To be accepted, a gift must satisfy the following criteria:

1. Will have a purpose consistent with those of the school.
2. Will be offered by a donor acceptable to the Board.
3. Will not begin a program which the Board would be unwilling to continue when the gift or grant funds are exhausted.
4. Will not bring undesirable or hidden costs to the District.
5. Will not place unreasonable restrictions on the school program.
6. Will not be inappropriate or harmful to the best education of pupils.
7. Will not imply endorsement of any business or product.
8. Will not be in conflict with any provisions of policy, school code or public law.

All gifts, grants and bequests will become school property to be used at the discretion of the school unless otherwise specified in the bequest.

The North Lake School District shall not discriminate in acceptance and administration of gifts, bequests, scholarships and other aids, benefits of services to students or the school from private agencies, organizations or persons on the basis of sex, race, religion, color, handicap, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
