

PARTICIPATION OF NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL OR HOME BASED INSTRUCTION STUDENTS IN DISTRICT COURSES/PROGRAMS

Once a student selects a home-based educational program or private school program, the parent is responsible for the child's educational program, the public school is not. Instructional materials and equipment shall not be available to students not attending the public school. The parents can be provided with general information and curriculum guidelines; however, instructional materials will not be provided.

Participation in district courses is a courtesy accorded residents. Resident students who do not attend public school may enroll in non-core classes in the public school if the following conditions are met:

1. Space is available
2. There is no additional cost to the District
3. The course is not a core curriculum class (core classes include: reading, language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, and health)
4. Enrollment does not contradict the laws regarding requirements for private school or home school students
5. The student is academically qualified to take the course
6. Transportation and any cost thereof is provided by the student/parent
7. A pro-rated student book fee is assessed
8. The student abides by all school rules and regulations including being on the public school premises only during the time that the class is in session
9. Application for participation is submitted in writing to the District Administrator.

The North Lake School District realizes that extra-curricular activities and all school-sponsored organizations have been established for the sole benefit of students attending the North Lake School District. Therefore, students enrolled in a private school, parochial school, or home based instruction may not participate in any public school extra-curricular activity except as follows:

1. The course or activity program is specifically required by law
2. The course or activity is held in conjunction with a summer school or summer camp

A decision denying a request may be appealed to the District Administrator. If not resolved by the District Administrator, an appeal may be made to the School Board.
