

STUDENT SUSPENSIONS

The school administration may suspend students in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes for noncompliance with rules established by the school and approved by the Board, or rules established by the Board. A student may be suspended for not more than five (5) consecutive days under the following statutory provisions:

- Prior to any suspension, the student shall be advised of the reason for the proposed suspension.
- The student shall be provided opportunity to present his/her version of the conduct prior to a determination of the proposed suspension.
- The student may be suspended if the school administrator determines that the pupil is guilty of noncompliance with school rules or if the suspension is reasonably justified.
- The parent or guardian of the suspended student shall be given written notice of the suspension, the reason(s) for the suspension, the length of the suspension, and notification of the appeals process. Students on in-school suspensions are prohibited from attendance at school activities. Students on out-of-school suspensions are prohibited from attendance at school activities and/or being on school grounds for the term of the suspension.
- Parent/guardian notification will be made prior to the start of the suspension except when extreme circumstances prohibit such notification by the administration. Parents will then be notified in as timely a fashion as possible.
- A suspended student shall not be denied the opportunity to take examinations missed during the suspension period.
- The administration has the right and responsibility to determine whether the suspension should be an “in-school” or an “out-of-school” suspension.

It is the policy of the North Lake School District, pursuant to s. 118.13, Wis. Statutes., and PI 9, that no person, on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional, or learning disability, or a disability under Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 may be denied admission to any school in this district or be denied participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extracurricular, pupil services, recreational, or other program. This policy applies to all school operations, including school-sponsored programs and activities.
