

PUBLIC COMPLAINTS ABOUT THE CURRICULUM OR INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS

The Board reserves to itself the final responsibility for all library and instructional materials used and curricula taught in the school District.

The Board also recognizes that District residents have a right to express concern about the educational programs of their school. When citizens have concerns about particular courses or library/instructional material, these concerns should be addressed in the following manner:

1. Normally, concerns should be first called to the attention of the individual teacher for settlement.
2. If further consideration is necessary, the matters in question should be called to the attention of the District Administrator for settlement.
3. If sufficient satisfaction is not obtained by citizens in their dealings with the teacher or District Administrator, the citizen may submit a written statement following the procedural steps and form cited in policy 6026: A,B,C.

The North Lake School District shall not discriminate in the selection and evaluation of instructional and library materials on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
