Dear Family,

North Lake School District will make every effort to educate your child to help your child on the appropriate use of the computer, internet and social media. The District has a filtering system in place for the internet that so far has filtered out objectionable material, but we cannot guarantee that your child will not come across inappropriate or not age appropriate materials. The staff at the District will report any site that wasn't properly filtered to the appropriate District personnel. We ask your assistance in developing responsible attitudes, reinforcing appropriate behaviors, and reinforcing security practices on the network. The students will receive instruction to properly find and utilize appropriate internet information.

- 1. All use of the North Lake Network must be in support of **education and research** which is consistent with the goals of the North Lake School District.
- 2. A staff member must remain in the room to provide direct supervision of the Internet.
- 3. Any request to download or print information off the Internet must first be approved by the teacher.

Students shall:

- 1. only login using **your** name and password;
- 2. receive authorization to use the computers/network/internet
- 3. respectfully take care of all computer equipment;
- 4. ask your teacher for the appropriate sites/links as to where he/she would like you to do or go;
- 5. follow all safety rules that were taught to you. Should you get on an objectionable site, immediately tell your teacher and get off the site;
- 6. not download anything to the school's computer without permission from your teacher.
- 7. be aware of copyright laws and what you may or may not download.
